Human Rights Council, 25th Session Item 2: OHCHR Report on Sri Lanka + Discussion Statement by the Government of Japan Geneva, 26 March 2014

Thank you, Mr. President,

Japan appreciates the OHCHR's efforts to improve the human rights situation in Sri Lanka. We also commend the cooperation of the Government of Sri Lanka with human rights mechanisms including its acceptance of visits by the High Commissioner and the Special Rapporteur on the human rights of internally displaced persons.

Japan remains committed to supporting those efforts aimed at achieving concrete progress in the human rights situation in Sri Lanka.
