Globally, the scale and complexity of forced displacement is unprecedented as 74.8 million people are forcibly displaced with rising numbers in protracted situations and living outside of camps. As host countries face overstretched resources, a development approach that enhances the humanitarian-development-peace nexus is indispensable to achieve durable solutions in the spirit of the Global Compact on Refugees.

This session brings together host countries and development actors to discuss sustainable and comprehensive solutions for forced displacement and how these can be expanded and replicated in other refugee settings. The session particularly highlights the importance of capacity building and support for refugee-hosting countries and communities. Other key topics include strengthening refugee selfreliance, preventing the emergence of displacement crises, and enhancing harmonious co-existence between the forcibly displaced and their hosts.

We welcome representatives of host countries and countries of origin as well as humanitarian and development practitioners to join us at the session for a productive discussion.

H.E. Mr. Ken Okaniwa is Ambassador/Deputy Permanent Representative of Japan to international organizations in Geneva. Hon. Namuyangu Kacha Jenipher is the Minister of State for Local Government in Ugandan Cabinet. She is the elected Member of Parliament for kibuku District women's representative from 2016 to date. She previously served as the Minister of State for Water Resources, Minister of State for Industry and Technology, the elected Member of Parliament for Pallisa District Women's Representative, and Chairperson for the Nile Equatorial Lakes Council of Ministers of Water. She holds a Master's Degree in Forestry, Makerere University and a Bachelor's Degree in forestry, Makerere University.

## H.E. Ambassador Khalid al-Shawabkeh (The Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan)



H.E. Ambassador Khalid al-Shawabkeh is Director of the International Relations and Organizations Department, the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan, and focuses on Syrian crisis and refugee issues. He was a Chef de Cabinet of the Minister of Foreign Affairs and Expatriates from 2011-2013, and Head of Jordan's Representation Office in Palestine from 2013-2018. He holds a MBA Executive Management from Ashland University, USA. He was awarded by the: Order of Jerusalem, Star of Jerusalem.

### Ms. Nobuko Kayashima (JICA)



Dr. Nobuko Kayashima is JICA's Senior Vice President (Peacebuilding, Africa etc). She joined JICA after graduating from Kyoto University (Japan), and has been leading the Education sector.
